WHEREAS Ms. Depkin was named a Library Journal Mover & Shaker, an international recognition of her foresight and leadership on the topic of sustainability; and

WHEREAS Ms. Depkin has exemplified dignified, pragmatic, and professional leadership alongside her colleagues, which has inspired thousands of library professionals across the planet,
